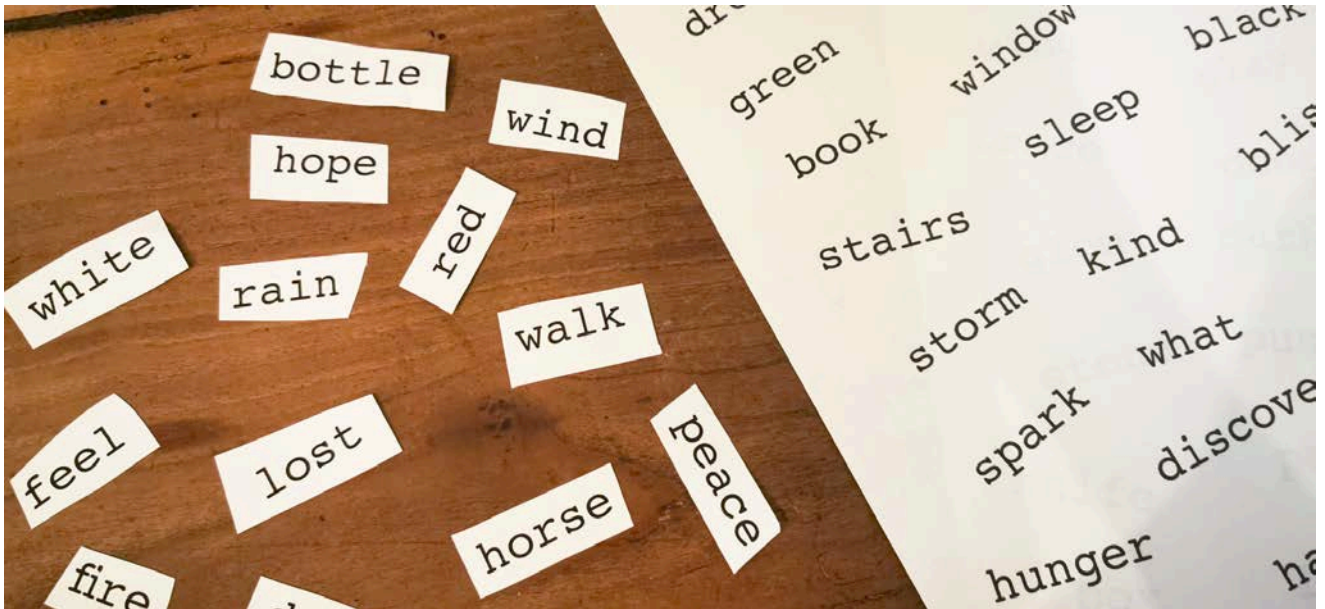
Write a Collaged Poem

MATERIALS

- Notebook or paper and some A4 card
- Word inspiration sheets
- Scissors
- Glue stick
- Writing Pen

Cut out the sheet of word prompts and spread the words on a table or tray.

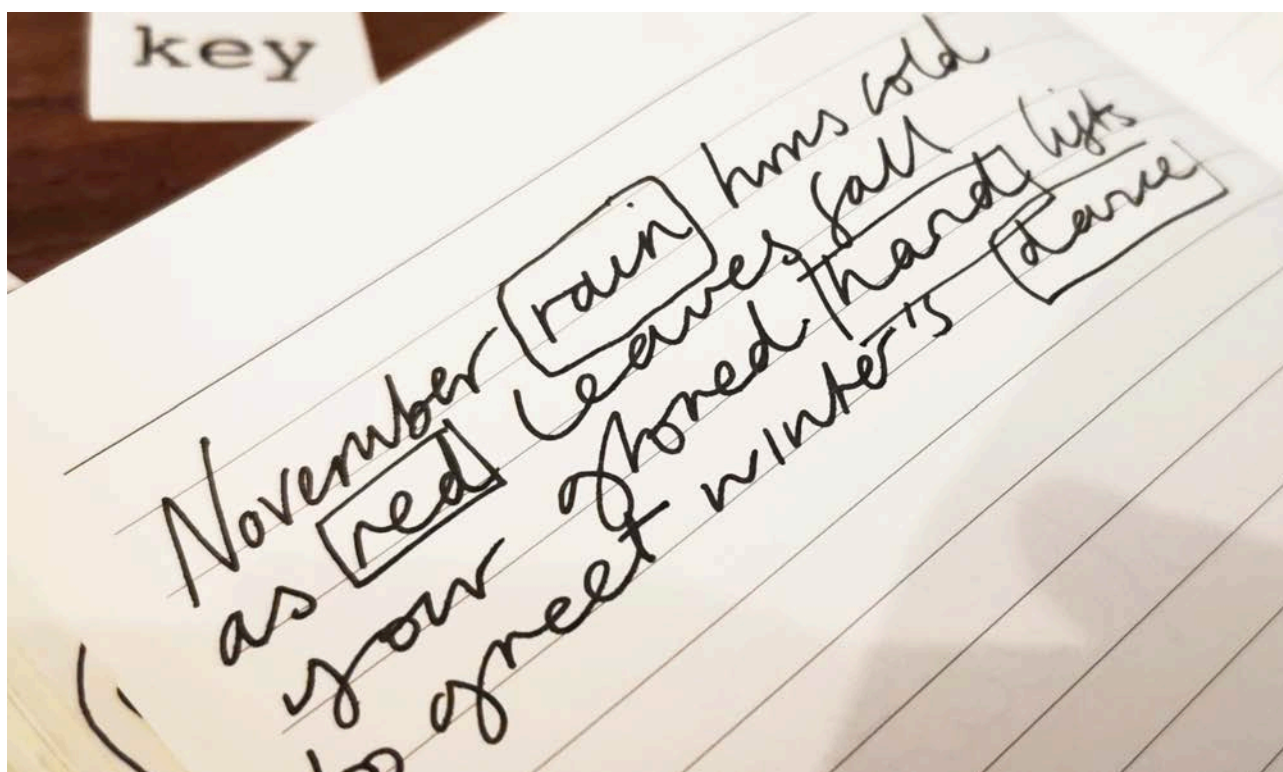




Now select six words you really like.



Now we're going to do some writing! Using these six words, try to write six lines of poetry. Each line should contain one of the words you've chosen (see examples), and your word can be anywhere in the sentence you choose.



If you need a starting point, put your cutout word at the beginning and write a sentence beginning with that word. The lines don't have to make sense or form a complete poem, it's just a bit of fun. Have a look at the examples on the next page for some inspiration.

Make as many poems as you like, you can use more collaged words if you like or add words cut out from newspapers or magazines. Maybe you could put your favourite one on the wall or put it in a frame!
